Communications at the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross and is granted by the authority of the Holy See.

This study program is designed for the student who is passionate about communication, literature, art, history, philosophy, and religion. The courses provide a perspective of both the human person and society, as a whole, that is **rooted in Christian principles underpinning our culture**.

Program

The programme consists of 180 ECTS credits (European University Training Credits), that span four fields of study. Here are just a few of the courses we offer:

• **Humanities**: History of Contemporary Ideas, Rhetoric, Sacred Art and Architecture (in English), History of Christian Literature (in English), History of Ancient, Medieval, Modern and Contemporary Society and Church...

• **Communications**: Written Information, Audiovisual Language, History of Cinema, Artificial Intelligence and Communication, Strategy and Social Media, Radio and Podcasts, Marketing, Sociology...

• **Philosophy**: Epistemology, Philosophy of Man, Political Philosophy, Philosophy of Religions, Moral Philosophy...

• **Theology**: Introduction to Christian Mystery, Social Doctrine of the Church, Ecumenical Dialogue, Communication and the Bible, Bioethics...

The baccalaureate, a three-year program, is designed to **give students a robust intellectual foundation for continuing their studies** or career according to their skills and interests.
